Introduction

Between February and June of 2003, community members and other stakeholders were invited to participate in the early stages of creating a long-term vision for sustainability in Moston Vale and the Irk Valley in North Manchester¹. The envisioning was carried out with participants from NGOs, community groups, academia, public and private sector organisations.

These notes accompany the landscape plan created for the Moston Vale, providing more detail than the report for the envisioning process. The landscape plan and its accompanying report can be downloaded from http://www.holocene.net/irk.htm.

There are two tables. The first shows some detailed design notes for the plan, the second is a recording of the ideas developed in the workshops for the site, with notes as to location. The final heading in each table shows which category of the E.A.S.E.L. $^{\text{TM}^2}$ the ideas fall under.

² The **E.A.S.E.L.™** is framework for organizing design information, created as a Mind Map with moveable branches under the headings: **Economics**, **Activities**, **Social** Capital, **Elements** and Settlements, **Landscapes**. Each heading can be expanded to a more detailed Mind Map with sub-headings, which act as DesignWays' architecture for organising participants' ideas.

Further Design Ideas and Notes

Ideas	Benefits
Community Pavilion	Utilised by groups for: Displays, Performance, Workshops, Concerts, Arts/crafts, Talks, Events (BBQs) Provides minimum seating, Shelter, Storage, Consider materials: vandals, Recycled brick etc., Lockable: garage door Artistic panels, Display space, Notice board
Outdoor Theatre	Cultural displays, Health awareness, Centre of events at markets, Centre of events at football, it is a community structure. Use at festivals and activities, Storage: arts material, sports equipment (e.g. tennis nets). Could provide a venue for a Farmers' Market.
Skate Park	Seating for viewing of activities, multifunctional skate park and bike area, with challenging BMX track and skate features such as ½ pipe, Bowl: ¼ pipe, jump ramp, rail slide. This area needs further design work involving youth groups.
BMX (Bike) Path	Path width 2 metres, incorporates mounds and curves Start/finish Line, Think about dirt/ gravel/ mulch, Litter picking policy with youth groups using the site
Cycle/Pedestrian Paths	Width: 2.5 metres (cycle 1.5, pedestrian 1m) Use specifications of the Transpenine trail 2 metres or 2.5 metres same surface: fine gravel, light brown/white look Use edge: brick (recycled from demolition in the area) or P.C.C edge, Use rolled resin bound gravel (is permeable)
Play Area	Climbing, balance, Science area (e.g. water channels, big features for measuring): active play Rubber impact surface: coloured, Colourful, Fenced/kissing gate, Seating, Sculptural divide (community workshop to design and implement)
Parking (may be necessary in the future)	Problems in the past with prostitution/vandals, Keep close to road, Lighting, Consider 7 pm (10 pm summer) gate locked, Signage, Utilise existing hard standing at eastern corner of site.
Dog Runs	Fence at 600 mm, bow top fence: consider safety, Minimum 25 metres by 15 metres (plan)
Boardwalk	Consider recycled plastic (more difficult to burn) May need handrail
Planting	Low spots: silver birch clumps with wildflowers, Accentuate mounds, Deciduous/evergreen mix, Wildflowers on edges, Furniture: bolt on option for willow sculpture/temporary art
Interpretation	Information about former brick and clay works, Sculptures, Where's the brook? Witches ravine and wishing stone, Site of old stepping stone, historical use of waterways in the area for industry
General	Need signs in the area to point to the site, create a greenway path between schools and the site, Clear stem pruning existing plantings, to maintain site lines
